REMINDER

2024-2025 PreK Child Counts Reporting Guidance and Deadlines

- This is a reminder that all PreK student counts must be added **monthly** via the [Student Information Repository System \(SIRS\)](#).
- To calculate the final payment for the 2024-2025 program year, the [Office of Early Learning](#) will look at the data sets from October and March and select the higher of the two. **The second data set will be pulled on March 12, 2025.**
- The [Office of Early Learning](#) has created a Child Counts Checklist to help districts prepare for March 2025 PreK Child Counts. The checklist is available on the Early Learning [Allocations and Financial Forms website](#).

Governor Hochul Announces Release of New York's First Media Literacy Toolkit for Educators

- New York's first 'Media Literacy' toolkit for educators will help teach students how to spot mis/dis/mal-information online.
- Following a surge in online hate speech in November 2023, Governor Hochul

- directed the State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services to work with experts to develop and distribute an ideologically neutral product that gives teachers resources to develop students' ability to analyze, evaluate, and assess all forms of media, including information delivered through social media.
- The toolkit is the first in a series of resources on media literacy the Division intends to produce and serves as a primer for educators throughout New York looking to introduce their students to these concepts.
- The State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services and the New York State Education Department will work closely with BOCES across New York to provide professional learning opportunities for educators on how to use these resources to support student media and digital literacy.

New York State Complaint Procedures

- The New York State Education Department (NYSED) Office of Special Education (OSE) has revised its Questions and Answers on the procedures for State complaint allegations being addressed in an impartial hearing.
- Question 13e was revised to clarify that, upon completion of the impartial hearing, if the issue(s) has not been addressed in the impartial hearing officer's decision, NYSED will conduct a State complaint investigation unless the complainant withdraws the alleged violation.

Public School Registration (PSR) Process

- In accordance with section 100.21(c) of Commissioner's Regulations, school districts must complete the Public School Registration process if they plan to make any of the following changes to a public school for the 2025–2026 school year:
 - opening a new public school;
 - closing an existing public school;
 - modifying the grade organization of an existing public school, including adding PreK; and/or
 - changing the location of a school.
- School districts considering or anticipating making any such changes are encouraged to provide SchoolRegistration@nysed.gov with a summary of the proposed changes.
- Beginning in early January 2025, the Department will provide Public School

- The deadline to submit applications for opening a new school and/or making changes to existing schools for the 2025–2026 school year is March 1, 2025.
